

₹34 lakh average annual salary for IIM-C students

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Kolkata: IIM-Calcutta registered 100 placement record for its outgoing 57th batch with an average salary of Rs 34 lakhs per annum with the consulting sector making 49% of the offers.

Several new recruiters like IIFL, Nykaa, Zomato, Premji Invest, Emaar and Protiviti made a beeline to pick up talent from the campus.

A total of 465 students took part in the final placement process receiving 631 offers. Around 190 firms participated in the final placement process.

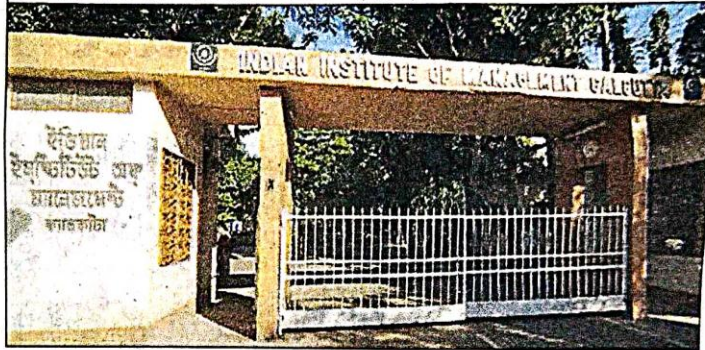
Accenture Strategy, Bain & Company, Boston Consulting Group and McKinsey & Company were some of the top recruiters. Companies like Amazon, Flipkart, Microsoft and Paytm rolled out 19% of overall offers in the product management and operations domains.

The entire process which got over last week was conducted virtually.

The institute followed a cluster-based system where the participating firms were mapped to cohorts that were further mapped to their respective cluster. The process was conducted to prioritize student-recruiter fit as students were given an option to hold and wait after getting an offer and to apply across clusters.

IIM-C authorities feel the pandemic could not weaken the resolve of the students who did very well despite the uncertainty due to

Covid-19. "The 57th batch has undergone several transitions due to the pandemic situation and all of us at IIM-C are very proud of their achievements," said Manish Thakur, dean (NIER), IIM Calcutta.
