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## IIM-V revamps electives for exec MBA

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Visakhapatnam: Indian Institute of Management-Visakhapatnam has revamped its elective courses for its two-year, non-residential post graduate programme for experienced professionals (PGPEx/MBA) for the 2022-24 batch. The unique programme is positioned to hone the management skills of the students to make them evolve into transformational leaders," said Prof Chandrasekhar.

"Reinforcing the solid technical abilities of these executives, the programme focuses on improving human abilities and visioning. The programme develops a better understanding of the demands and challenges faced in modern business organisations," said Prof Chandrasekhar.

Chairperson, PGPEx, Prof Saroj Kumar Pani said classes are conveniently scheduled in the evenings and over weekends. "The programme focuses on experiential and application-oriented learning to nurture leadership competencies and requisite skills. At the end of the course, students will have functional expertise as well as a generic knowledge of all areas of management," said Prof Saroj Kumar.
