

# IIMC's 2021-22 batch records 100% placement

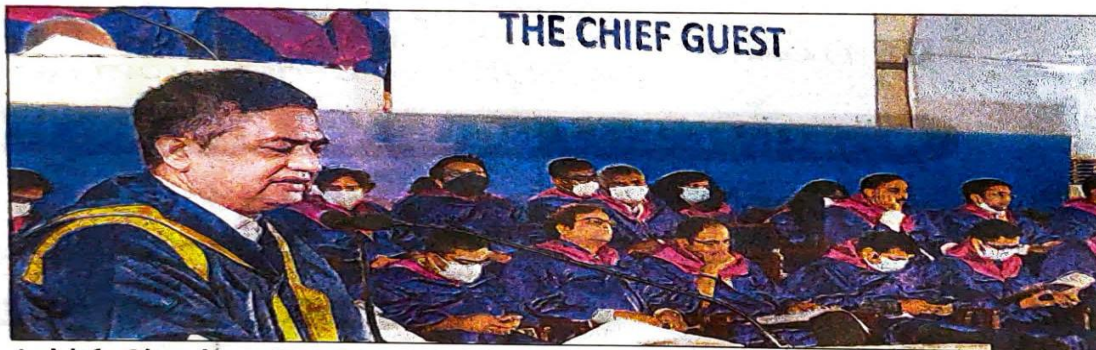

IIM Calcutta registered 100% placement record for its outgoing 57<sup>th</sup> batch with an average salary of Rs 34 lakh per annum with the consulting sector making 49% of the offers. Several new recruiters like IIFL, Nykaa, Zomato, PremjiInvest, Emaar and Protiviti made a beeline to pick up talent from the campus.
